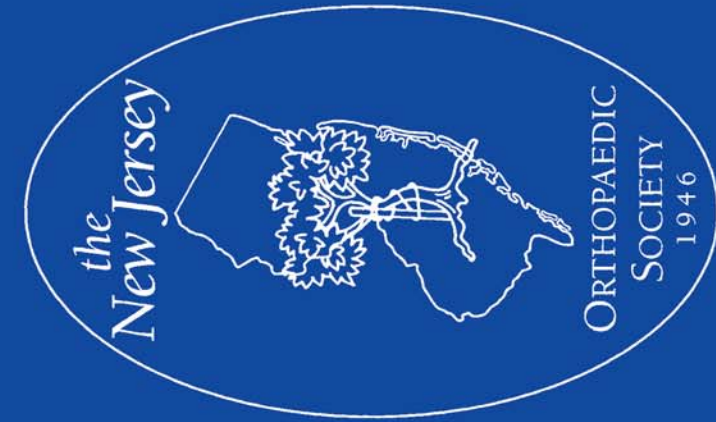

## LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Discuss unique wear resistant patterns evaluated by RSA
- Predict differential problems of contemporary alternative bearings
